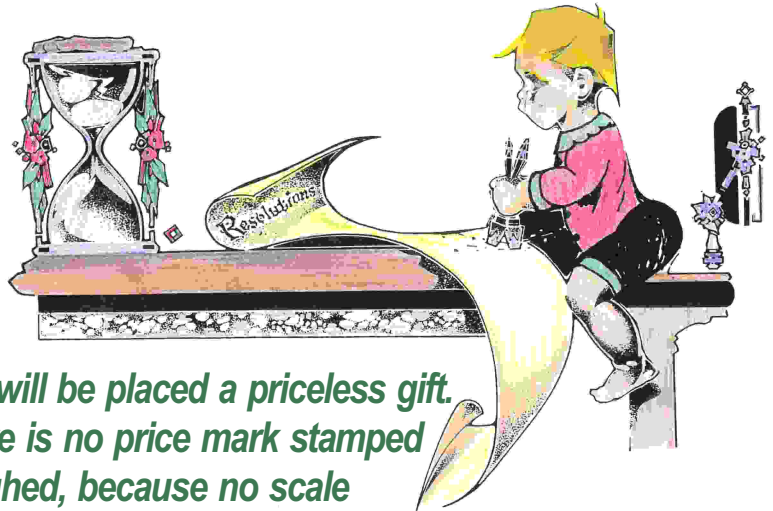

- I will make thy name to be remembered in all generations: therefore shall the people praise thee for ever and ever (Psalm 45:17).

- I will go into thy house with burnt offerings: I will pay thee my vows (Psalm 66:13).
- I will hope continually, and will yet praise thee more and more (Psalm 71:14).
- I will hear what God the LORD will speak: (Psalm 85:8).

- I will sing unto the LORD as long as I live: I will sing praise to my God while I have my being (Psalm 104:33).

- I will praise thee; for I am fearfully and wonderfully made: (Psalm 139:14).
- I will declare thy greatness (Psalm 145:6).

When loneliness closes in on me, Psalms 18:2 brightens the night like a glowing candle.

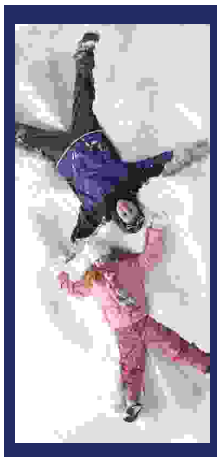
