 - A: First of all, we see Paul's Commission
 - o II Timothy 1:11
 - o Look at what he declared here in this verse to Timothy...
 - 1: By the will of God, Paul knew he had been "appointed a preacher"
 - 2: By the will of God, Paul knew he had been made to be "an apostle"
 - Ephesians 2:19-22, I Corinthians 9:1-2
 - 3: By the will of God, Paul knew that he had been commissioned by God to not only preach the message of the Gospel as an authorized Apostle of God, but he was to work with those who were treated as outcasts by the Jews, but whom he had led to Christ and now served as being "a teacher of the Gentiles."
